

Changes to the Family Law Act from May 2024

The *Family Law Amendment Act 2023* was passed by the Australian Parliament on 19 October 2023.

Most of the changes to the law will apply from 6 May 2024.

These changes may affect you if either:

- a court is currently considering your parenting arrangements.
- you are trying to determine the right parenting arrangement for your child.

The new laws will make changes to law about parenting arrangements, including:

- introducing a simpler list of factors for courts to consider when deciding parenting arrangements.
- removing the 'presumption' of equal shared responsibility.

There are a number of other important changes in the *Family Law Amendment Act 2023*. These include:

- requirements for Independent Children's Lawyers to meet directly with children.
- simpler compliance and enforcement provisions for child-related orders
- new powers for the courts to prevent harmful litigation.
- new powers to enable government to regulate family report writers.

Family dispute resolution

The <u>Family Law Act 1975</u> requires separating and separated families who have a dispute about children to make a genuine effort to sort it out through <u>family dispute resolution</u>.

The Act also requires that they take part in family dispute resolution before attending court unless one of the exceptions applies, such as family violence, child abuse or urgency.



Evaluation of the Children's Contact Service Activity.

In 2023 the Attorney-General's Department commissioned the Australian Institute of Family Studies (AIFS) to undertake a review of Children's Contact Services – a service offering funded under the Department's Family Relationship Services Program. The evaluation report was published in December 2023.

Children's Contact Services (CCs) facilitate the supervision of the parenting time and changeover for families most commonly where the parents are separating, or have separated, and require a safe and neutral venue to enable contact to take place.
